CLASS RULES

Green Horse Two Handed:

Eligibility: Horses with less than \$50 NRHA earnings or no breed points (i.e., AQHA, etc.) prior to the current year. 2. Competition license not required. 3. Any rider may exhibit. No membership requirements. 4. Horse may show in other classes, but NRHA license required and rider(s) and owner(s) must be NRHA members.

Rules during showing: Horse may be ridden with one or two hands, providing the rider remains consistent throughout the run. 2. Horse may be ridden in any NRHA approved bit. 3. All other NRHA rules apply. Awards: Ribbon and trophy to first place, ribbons to sixth.

Green Rookie:

This is for riders who are in their first or second year new to reining and who have not earned \$100 in NRHA classes as of January 1 of the current year. Riders may use any horse.

Eligibility: Membership in NRHA not required to show. 2. NRHA horse license not required. 3. Rider may show in any other class, but then rider and owner(s) must be members of NRHA and horse must have an NRHA license.

Rules during showing: Green rookie may break to a trot, come to a complete stop, or attempt a flying change without penalty. 2. Horse may be ridden with one or two hands, providing the rider remains consistent throughout the run. 3. Horse may be ridden in any NRHA approved bit. 4. All other NRHA rules apply. Awards: Belt buckle donated by Gary and Jane Pipkin. Ribbons to six places.

By entering either class, riders certify their eligibility under these rules. Protests will be resolved based on official breed or NRHA show records. Proof of eligibility will be the responsibility of the rider and/or owner.

Club Classes: No license/ownership/membership requirements except a Non Pro must ride in the Non Pro class. Ribbon awards only.

Paid Warm Up: Not judged, four (4) minute maximum per slot. Limit of 20 slots, 2 slots per rider. Order of go will be drawn. \$25.00 per slot. Paid entries due by May 10th.

NRHA/Larimer County Checklist

- ✓ Rider's Membership Card - If showing in Non Pro and Rookie classes, you must first obtain NRHA non pro status prior to showing. Youth must also apply for non pro status to show in Non Pro and Rookie classes. If showing in Youth classes, you must have a youth membership card.
- ✓ Owner's Membership Card - If different from rider, owner must also be a member and card or copy must be presented to show management. If multiple ownership, all owners must be members.
- ✓ Competition License - All horses entered in NRHA approved competitions are required to have a competition license. Application must take place through the NRHA office prior to showing. **LICENSE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AT SHOWS.** If you have purchased a horse, please check with the previous owner or the NRHA office. Your horse may already have a competition license that must be transferred only through the NRHA office prior to showing. If an exhibitor forgets his/her license, he/she will not be able to reapply at the show.
- ✓ Eligibility - Check with NRHA for class eligibility of riders and horses.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

PRE-ENTRIES APPRECIATED BY MAY 10, 2009

ENTRIES: Entries must be made on regulation entry blanks, copy of which is enclosed. No telephone entries will be accepted. These forms are to be filled out, signed by the exhibitor and/or agent, with the full remittance for fees and stabling filed with the secretary according to the time limit herein described. Be sure that the name and description of your horse and the class in which it is entered is clearly shown. Additional entry forms may be obtained from the show secretary. Copies of the entry blank will also be accepted.

PERSONAL CHECKS: The show secretary will use her discretion in cashing exhibitors' personal checks. There will be a \$50.00 charge for any returned checks. Replacement of monies must be in the form of cash, money order or certified check. Management reserves the right to refuse payment in the form of a check from any exhibitor. Colorado State Statute 13-21-109 will be enforced.

REFUNDS: No refunds on class entries will be paid after day entries close, unless the horse or rider entered has become ill and the exhibitor provides the secretary with the official veterinarian or doctor's certificate stating that the horse or rider is unable to show. Certificate must be received within one week after show. No refund will be paid if exhibitor fails to show an officially entered horse for any other reason. NO STALL OR OFFICE FEE REFUNDS. Refunds will be mailed with paybacks.

PAYBACKS: Paybacks will be mailed within 45 days after conclusion of show.

QUESTIONS AND DISPUTES: The Larimer County Spring Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to and arising out of or incident to the show, without claim for damages or recourse of any kind.

WEATHER: In case of inclement weather or major damage to the ring or facilities prior to or during the show, the judges and show committee shall have the right to order any one or all classes stopped without claim or recourse whatsoever.

NOT RESPONSIBLE: The 40th Annual Larimer County Spring Horse Show Committee, the National Western Complex, or the CSU Veterinary Teaching Hospital, or any of their employees will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed or stolen. The show will have on duty during the nighttime hours a guard to supervise the horses and equipment to the best of his ability.

EXERCISE AREA: There will be an exercise area for schooling. The show ring will not always be available for schooling your horses.

FARRIER: The Larimer County Spring Horse Show Official Farrier is required to be on grounds during all performances. Anyone needing assistance in that regard must make arrangements directly with the show farrier.

PARKING AND TRAILERS: Due to fire regulations, cars, trailers, vans, and campers must be parked in the designated parking areas which are clearly posted. Any vehicles parked incorrectly may be towed away. No trailers will be allowed in the paddock or on the road at any time. Limited trailer hookups are available for a fee which is to be paid to the Larimer County Horse Show prior to hookup.

STALLS: Every horse must be stalled or pay a grounds fee. All stalls are covered and have doors. Stalls will be assigned as the entries arrive at the secretary's office. Only the manager has the right to move or to reassign stalls as is deemed necessary. The show management has the right to refund entry and stall fees to any exhibitor not acting in the best interest of the show and requiring said person to vacate stalls and remove himself from the grounds. Stalls will be available Tuesday, May 19 after 8:00 a.m. Stalls must be vacated the morning of May 26. Late entries should check with the show management regarding availability of stalls. *Tack stalls may be purchased at the same fee as other horse stalls.* Those staying for the Region 8 Arabian Show must check with office prior to end of show. Only wood shavings allowed for bedding.

DOGS: City of Denver Code does not allow dogs on the grounds of the National Western facility. Under Larimer County Horse Show's contract with National Western, show management is responsible for enforcing the code and will contact the City of Denver code enforcement office to impound dogs.

SKATEBOARDS, BIKES, SCOOTERS, IN-LINE SKATES, MOTORIZED VEHICLES: All are prohibited inside National Western buildings. Violators will have their equipment confiscated until the end of the show. Unlicensed minors may not operate motorized vehicles of any kind on the show grounds.

DINING: Concession stands will be open for the exhibitors' convenience on the show grounds.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All out-of-state horses are to be examined by a licensed veterinarian and found to be free of any infectious, contagious or communicable diseases, and such information must be properly recorded on a health certificate accompanying each horse. For entry into Colorado, a Coggins test is required.

HORSES NOT COMPETING: Any horse on the grounds not entered in the show must have a signed entry blank filed with the show office and pay a fee of \$125 to cover stall and office fees.

OFFICE HOURS: May 19—12:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m.
May 20-25—One hour before the first performance until conclusion of last performance each day.
